Organizational Purpose

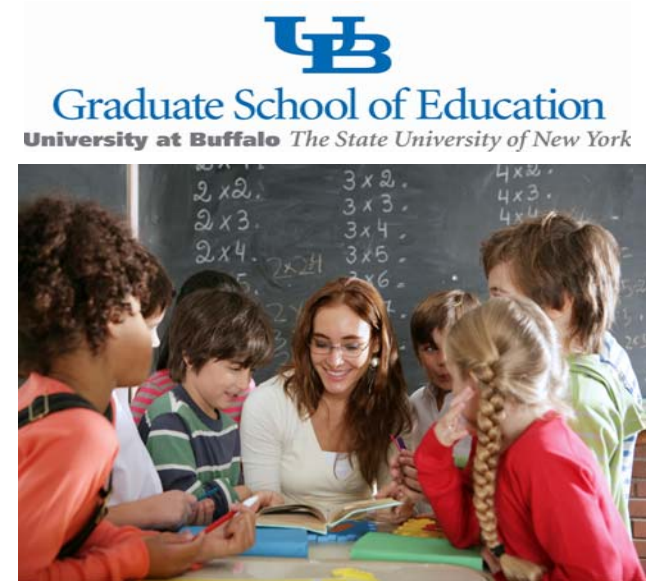
