# <u>Collaborating to Address Safety & Mental Health Issues,</u> <u>and to Recover from Crises</u>

The goal of this seminar is to help participants enhance collaboration, address mental health issues, deescalate crises, and learn lessons about response and recovery from school-based tragedies.

### PRESENTERS: Michele Gay and Mo Canady

Michele Gay is a mother, former teacher, and one of the founders of Safe and Sound Schools: A Sandy Hook Initiative. After losing her daughter, Josephine Grace, on Dec. 14, 2012, she chose to take action as an advocate for improved school security and safety in our nation's schools.

In 2011, after completing a 25-year career in law enforcement with the City of Hoover, Alabama Police Department, **Mo Canady** became the Executive Director for the National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO). A Law Enforcement Instructor since 1993, Canady became an instructor for NASRO in 2001, and a board member in 2005. He is a past President of the Alabama Association of School Resource Officers.

Participants will learn how to recognize signs of an individual in crisis and how to de-escalate these situations.
