 - o LAI 667
 - o LAI 698 (L2)
 - o LAI 620
- LAI 414/514 and LAI 552 are typically completed during the summer before or after the fall-spring sequence
- Students must enroll in LAI 620, 667, and 698 the fall semester immediately preceding LAI 674.
- Students must enroll in LAI 674, 668, and 595 in the same semester.
 - * Undergraduate coursework (LAI 414, CEP 400, and ELP 405) is only applicable if previously completed as a UB undergraduate student with a grade of "B-" or better.

- Meet any conditions of admission and/or continued admission
- Complete any required content area or general education courses
